Dues Are Due 2014-2015

Many of our members have already succeeded in navigating the new ONCARD system to pay their dues for 2014-2015. Very few people have reported having any trouble with it.

Since some people are still unaware that the AGO's dues collection procedure has now been absorbed into a nationwide database that processes payments at AGO National Headquarters and remits a portion back to the local chapter, here are the instructions for paying dues the new way:

When you receive your emailed invoice from AGO headquarters, click on the link to ONCARD and follow the instructions which will guide you through the dues-paying process, or go onto the national website, www.agohq.org. From the homepage, click the Membership tab, then Renew My Membership. Login to ONCARD. Fill in the requested information, making sure that is up to date and complete, and pay. If you do not wish to pay by credit card, ONCARD will create an invoice for you. Print it out and mail it in to AGO/475 Riverside Drive, Suite 1260/New York, NY 10115-0055 with your check.

If you do not have access to a computer, you should have received, by US Mail, an invoice from AGO National Headquarters which you can simply mail in with your payment. In case you were not contacted with an invoice, you can call the national office at (212) 870-2310 and request a Membership Brochure. When you receive it, snip off the application form and mail it in with your payment. You can also ask any of our officers to log in for you. They can help you pay your dues with a credit card that way. Please do not, under any circumstances, hand a check to any of our officers without competing the registration form.

During the 2013-2014 fiscal year, the Brooklyn chapter was a pilot chapter in the development of ONCARD. To build such a complicated, multi-purpose national website is an enormous and complicated undertaking. Accordingly last year's dues-collection and record-keeping were fraught with bugs, SNAFUs, hitches and glitches. But, in my experience, ONCARD is working well now – easy to use and efficient. A few dual-chapter members have reported difficulties recording their dual status. I, personally, found that it processed my dual membership with no problem at all. I have directed dual members with registration issues to Leah Semiken, Manager of Membership and Chapter Relations, (212) 870-2311, ext. 7512, and she has been able to solve their problems.

If you are lacking in computer "chops" and need step-by-step guidance through the registration/renewal process, Timothy Chun, oceantim@hotmail.com, is the Brooklyn chapter's official ONCARD Liaison Officer.

If you have not already done so, please do take advantage of our wonderful, newfangled technology and get your dues-paying painlessly out of the way. I predict you will find it a significant improvement over the Good Old Days.

Pipe Organ Encounter - Brooklyn!

When we held our Bach to Brooklyn event last year, someone at one of our host churches suggested we do an AGO Pipe Organ Encounter (POE) at their location (not realizing, of course, that this is not the type of event that you just suddenly decide to do and "Presto!" it happens). But it got me to thinking that we have a really unique situation in Brooklyn: thousands of youth (a good number of whom study piano), hundreds of churches (often situated close by other churches, and, even more often than not, needing to find an organist), and an AGO chapter with some really dedicated people who have something to offer. Our chapter applied to the AGO Committee on the New Organist this past March and was approved by AGO National Council at the end of April. The focus of our curriculum will be skills that prepare young musicians for leading music in African American and Roman Catholic worship. This will be a unique feature of our POE and will serve to meet some real needs in many churches hiring musicians in our region.

For those who've never experienced a POE, they soon discover that this is a really intensive experience: one week, lots or organs, daily private lessons, listening to daily performances and the students (yes, some of whom have never played an organ!) performing at the end of the week. We have tentative approval from at least 3 churches with fine instruments and are working on 7 more. There are some fine organists with international reputations who have agreed to serve on our faculty (we'll be able to announce this soon), and we have housing arranged at the Bethany Methodist Home on East 40th street for a very low cost.

The most important thing we need to make this event a success is your involvement as a member of the chapter. Here are some things you can do:

1. Create buzz - blab our business with everyone you know about the fact that we are hosting a POE in Brooklyn;

2. Volunteer to help during the week next summer or beforehand. We need: Chaperones (for lessons, practice sessions and day-trips), all of whom will have to be cleared by a criminal background check and will receive training in youth safety issues Ushers for concerts (there will be public concerts as part of the week's events) Meal and activity facilitators;

3. Give to the Brooklyn Chapter POE fund. POE events cost quite a bit more than tuition provides, and while there is a \$5,000 grant provided by AGO National, that does require some evidence of significant fund-raising on the chapter's part before it is distributed. All gifts no matter how small are appreciated and needed. If you've not yet renewed your dues online, there is an opportunity in the renewal process to donate to this and other chapter funds;

4. Invite people to attend the events of that week next summer, and once our brochures are ready, ask for some and send them to potential participants or those with access to young people with readiness and interest.

Our committee so far is made up of the following chapter members: Ellen Wright (facilities), Gregory Eaton (faculty), Raymond Trapp (funding & services), Gary Di Franco (publicity), Sophie Williams Johnson (secretary/registrar), and Eric Birk (director). We look forward to hearing from you about in way in which you can take part in the success of this event.
